Code of Conduct



About this Booklet

This booklet contains the media election code of conduct. The Solomon Islands Electoral Commission in collaboration with the Media Association of Solomon Islands have revised and updated an existing Code of Conduct/election media policy for all local and international media representatives reporting the 2024 joint election.

This code of conduct/policy is designed to balance the complementary role of the Commission and its officers, with those of the media in a democratic society.

Media plays an important role in educating and informing citizens, a significant role that SIEC acknowledges and ensure cordial partnership continues to exist to achieve shared goals and objectives before, during and after any electoral event within an electoral cycle.

MEDIA ELECTION CODE OF CONDUCT

All broadcast, print, television and online journalists, both international and local, are required by the Solomon Islands Electoral Commission to apply for official accreditation that enables them to access registration centres, polling stations and SIEC press conferences.

1. Role of SIEC & Media Representatives

The Solomon Islands Electoral Commission acknowledges the important role that the media plays in the election process. At all times, SIEC endeavours to provide journalists with the information that they need, in a timely and efficient manner.

1.1. In signing this Code of Conduct the SIEC agrees to:

- 1.1.1. Hold regular briefings for journalists, provide constant and consistent information on the Joint Election and updating journalists on SIEC's activities
- 1.1.2. Respond to media inquiries in a timely and efficient manner
- 1.1.3. Where possible, facilitate access to SIEC sites and officials, and
- 1.1.4. Provide the media with access to results as quickly as is practicable under Solomon Islands law and established electoral conventions

1.2. In signing this Code of Conduct the journalist agrees to:

- 1.2.1. Act with rigor and professionalism, complying with all electoral laws and regulations and promoting democratic principles.
 - 1.2.2. Report on the National Joint - Election activities with balance and neutrality, and must refrain from becoming political party agents or agents of candidates as loss of media accreditation may occur should the latter occur.
 - 1.2.3. Report fairly and accurately on the registration, nomination of candidates, voting and counting process and avoid prejudice.
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2. Rights of Media Representatives

During the election, a media representative may:

- 2.1. Seek Electoral Related information at any time that is in the public's interest.
- 2.2. Move freely around the area outside a polling station, without obstructing voters from entering or leaving the polling station
- 2.3. Request to take photographs/videos outside of polling stations with the permission of all persons included in the photograph/video
- 2.4. Ask electors for an interview once they have voted. All interviews must be requested and conducted outside the polling station
- 2.5. Interview an Agent, Observer or Presiding Officer, if the person agrees to this, outside the station.
- 2.6. Enter a polling station for a specific, agreed purpose such as to photograph/film a candidate casting his or her ballot. This may only occur with the express consent of the Presiding Officer to grant access inside the polling station with accordance with Section 89 (4) of the Electoral Act 2018 and the consent of person being filmed or photographed; if this does not disrupt the polling process in any way or violate the secrecy of the vote.
- 2.7. Observe the securing of materials for overnight storage, follow the vehicle carrying election materials to the SIEC counting centre, and observe receipt of materials.
- 2.8. Enter a counting centre for a specific, agreed purpose but only with the express consent of the Returning Officer in accordance with section 99 (e) & (f) of the Electoral Act 2018. This may occur only if this does not disrupt the counting in any way or violate the secrecy of votes.
- 2.9. Report on results as they are declared by the Returning Officer in

accordance with Section 106 (a) and 107 (b) of the Electoral Act 2018, provided the results, other than the person who is declared to be elected, are reported as being “provisional” or “unofficial” results.

3. Responsibilities of Media Representatives

A media representative must not:

- 3.1. Seek to conduct interviews of any kind inside polling stations or counting centres
- 3.2. Film or photograph the face of any ballot paper, whether blank or marked
- 3.3. Film, photograph or interview any individual registrant/voter or Polling Official without her/his consent.
- 3.4. Film, photograph or record electors’ details when announced in polling stations
- 3.5. Film, photograph or copy the electoral register or any other document, which would infringe on the privacy of voters.
- 3.6. Do any other thing that might compromise the secrecy of votes or interfere with voting in any way

4. Conduct at Polling Places

While at a polling place, counting station or other SIEC site, an accredited media representative must:

- 4.1. Introduce themselves to the electoral official in charge at the polling stations and counting centres upon arrival
 - 4.2. Wear their Electoral Commission media accreditation tags at all times
 - 4.3. Comply with all instructions of electoral officials and police on
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duty during electoral proceedings.

- 4.4. Media representatives, like electoral officials, are also subject to the provisions of applicable electoral and other legislation when in attendance at electoral proceedings.

5. Media Interviews

Media representatives are not permitted to interview any voter, Agent, Observer or Polling Official inside the Station. They may interview the Presiding Officer as the representative of the team of Officials with her/his consent, but only outside the Station, if activities within the station permit this.

During interviews, the Presiding Officer may respond to general factual questions, but may not offer interpretations or opinions. The following guidelines should be followed.

- 5.1. Presiding Officers may respond to general, factual questions such as:
 - 5.1.1. Polling procedures
 - 5.1.2. Voter turnout in the Station
 - 5.1.3. Duties as a Polling Official
- 5.2. Presiding Officers may not offer interpretations or opinions, such as:
 - 5.2.1. Interpret results on a local, regional or national basis
 - 5.2.2. Comment on voting trends or expected outcomes
 - 5.2.3. Offer political commentary on political entities, candidates or the election
 - 5.2.4. Offer opinions on policy, compliance or speculate on other issues

6. **In signing the Code of Conduct, Media representatives acknowledge that they have read this document and agree to the above stated regulations.**

- 3** SORTING OF BALLOT BOXES INTO BATCHES





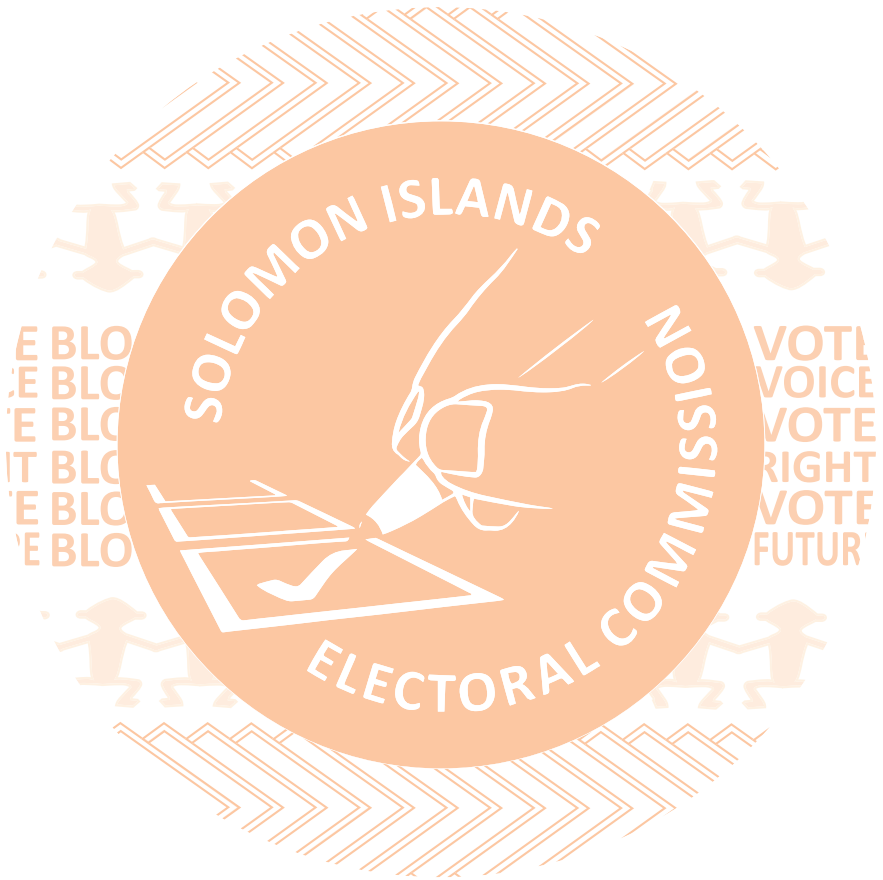
